Art 214 Beginning Painting (3 cr.)

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Painting in oil, acrylic, and watercolor. Open to non-art majors.

Objectives: In Art 214, we will work with both hard-edged and painterly techniques. We will work with still-life, abstraction, artist research, and artist's choice projects. We will work with acrylic paint on both paper and canvas.

Upon Completion of this class the student will:

- □ Understand the importance of value contrast in painting.
- □ Understand how to work with transparent and opaque colors.
- □ Study a Modern Artist in depth, and create a "study" of his or her work.
- □ Devise an idea, color scheme, and appropriate technique to create your own personal statement in paint.
