Requirements:

1. No class meetings
2. 36 hours of volunteer activity logged during the term
3. Complete four assignments (short response questions) online. Students will log onto blackboard, read an article and then proceed to an online survey site to answer a set of questions (no more than 10 questions each).
4. Reflection describing their volunteer experience (maximum length 5 pages)
