Course Description: The study of ethical counseling practices, behaviors and decision making, includes legal considerations, rights of clients, and counselor roles and values.

Course Format:

A variety of learning activities will be utilized during this course to provide students with the ability to acquire needed skills in the area of ethics and the helping professions.

Course Objectives:

- Develop understanding of ethical issues that may arise for professionals in the helping professions.
- Develop understanding and application of the ACA Code of Ethics as it applies to those working in the helping professions.
- Develop self-awareness with personal biases, attitudes, and values as they pertain to the helping professional.

- Develop research skills to enhance understanding of current events in the helping professions.
- ·Learn ethical decision models that can assist in the helping professions.

Assignments:

Students will work in groups & respond to an eithical scenario.(5)

1 Case Study will be conducted to assist students in applying the ACA code of Ethics.

Outside Activity-Students will conduct one of 7 options for an outside activity and follow guidelines provided.

Scenario Response-Students will be provided a scenario and critically analyze how they would respond using an ethical decision-making model.

Grading:

Weekly ethical group work-----225 points (5 @ 45 points each)

Case Study------150 points

Outside Activity----- 75 points
